Early Voting Opens for the 2019 Consolidated Election

Voting in the November 5, 2019 Consolidated Election begins Monday at the County of San Bernardino Registrar of Voters office for many of the registered voters living in or near Bloomington, Fontana, Rancho Cucamonga, Rialto and Victorville. Eligible voters can vote for one of the following offices up for election:

- Cucamonga Valley Water District, Divisions 1 and 2
- Three Members of the Board of Directors, one for each division, for 4-year terms
- Victor Valley Union High School District, Area 2
- One Member of the Governing Board for a 3-year term

- West Valley Water District, Divisions 1, 4 and 5

These voters do not have to wait for Election Day, or even wait to receive a ballot in the mail, to vote. Starting at 8 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 7, they can obtain and cast a ballot at the Registrar of Voters office, 777 E. Rialto Avenue in San Bernardino.

Early voting hours will be Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. except on Monday, Oct. 14, when all County offices are closed. On Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 5, the Reg-

istrar of Voters office will be open for voting from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Also on Monday, Oct. 7, mail ballots for voters on the permanent mail ballot list will be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service. Deliveries will continue as additional mail ballot requests are received up until Tuesday, Oct. 29.

To assist San Bernardino County voters, County Voter Information Guides were delivered to the U.S. Postal Service on Tuesday, Oct. 1. The guides include a sample ballot, candidate statements, and voting instructions.

The County's purchase of a

new voting system has caused one small change to the voting instructions – starting with this election, voters will fill in an oval to the left of the name of the candidate of their choice. In prior elections with the old voting system, votes were cast by drawing a line between two ends of an arrow located to the right of the candidate's name. Voters can also access the guide by visiting the Registrar of Voters website, SBCounty-Elections.com, and clicking on the Elections menu tab.

Early voting opens for the 2019 Consolidated Election.

For those voters who prefer to cast their ballot in person on

Election Day, the address of their assigned polling place will be printed on the back cover of their guide. Voters are encouraged to hold on to their guide until Election Day so they can easily find their polling place. But should a voter misplace a guide before Election Day, the voter may look up their assigned polling place by using the My Elections Gateway application on the Registrar of Voters website, or by calling (909) 387-8300.

Black Educators to Unveil “Blueprint” for Improving California Black Student Test Scores, Learning

A group of Black educators are heading to San Diego this week from around the state, and across the country, to meet with each other. Their goal is to leave their conference with strategies that school districts and policymakers can adapt to close the achievement gap for Black students in public schools.

From Thursday, Oct. 10 through Saturday, Oct. 12, the group will convene in San Diego at the 2019 conference of the California Association of Black School Educators (CABSE). They

plan to share research findings, best practices and actionable information that organizers say will “usher in a golden age of education policy.”

The theme of this year’s CABSE’s meeting is “Transforming the Playing Field.”

From common core and trauma-informed practices to multi-tiered systems of support and project-based learning, CABSE’s president Micah Ali says, there has been no shortage of strategies created to improve education outcomes for African-American students.

“Yet, why have we not seen much change? These interventions seem to each address a singular distinct problem at the heart of educational disparity without looking at how they interlink and overlap,” says Ali.

What CABSE does differently – and plans to do at this year’s conference - is bring together educators from varying backgrounds and all levels of education, some who have been traditionally opposed to each other like charter school operators and traditional school district officials.

Ali says his goal is to cross “sector lines” to advance a singular mission: “expanding pre-k through community college opportunities for under-represented and under-served Black students and students of color.”

At the end of the conference, CABSE will unveil its new “Educational Equity Blueprint.” According to CASBE, the document is expected to include guidelines that “emphasize a holistic “cradle-to-career” learning approach; embrace technology as an equity equalizer; challenge inherent biases; and promote positive education climates.”

“We are about empowering our children – teaching students that they can achieve anything that they set their mind to given they put in the hard work,” Ali added.

Nationwide, there is a 28-percentage-point test score gap between 17-year-old Black students and their White counterparts, according to the National Assessment of Educational Progress.

In California, there is more than a 40 percentage-point gap between African-American public school students’ standardized test scores and

that of their White counterparts. In math, the disparity is more than 50 percentage points.

“Seven years ago, we invested \$47.3 billion in our schools,” Gov. Newsom said in his 2019 State of the State speech in January. “But it’s not enough. We’re still 41st in the nation in per-pupil funding. Something needs to change. We need to have an honest conversation about how we fund our schools at a state and local level. But at the same time, let’s remember that the measure of a school system’s excellence is more than the sum of its budgets.”

The CABSE conference is happening at a time when Black high school graduates seem to be facing steeper climbs to get accepted into California’s public universities. California State University, for example, is proposing requiring an additional year of math for all high school students in the state as a requirement for admission.

In 2015, only about 30 percent of African-American high school graduates in California were admitted to the California State University system. If another year of math is required, that number will drop to 21 percent, according to a study conducted by RTI International.

Speakers at the CABSE conference will include Bryant T. Marks, Sr., founder of the National Training Institute on Race and Equity; Tyrone C. Howard, director of the UCLA Black Male Institute; and Dr. Kenneth Wesson, an education consultant and neuroscience expert.

Ali says solving inequities in public education will require looking at the roots of social and racial injustice that lie beneath the problems.

“It is imperative that we unlock our student’s

Gov. Signs Bills Benefitting Black-Owned Charter Schools and Newspapers

Gov. Gavin Newsom signed a number of bills last week.

Among them is one that will allow Black-owned-and-operated charter schools in California to continue to educate some 52,800 Black students in the state without the fear brought on - and intensified - by speculations that certain legislators, with the backing of teachers unions in California, were angling to shut them down.

The other will benefit African American-owned newspapers and other niche market newspapers.

AB 1505

The first, AB 1505, ends the uncertainty that put Black charter school operators on the defensive during a more-than-a-yearlong fight about the future of charter schools in the state.

Gov. Newsom signed AB 1505 on Oct. 3.

African American-owned charter schools in California are largely credited with working on the leading edge of efforts to close the wide academic achievement gap that exists between African-American students, who are the lowest performing racial group in the state, and their peers of other races.

In English Language Arts, for example, there is more than a 40 percentage-point gap between African-American public school students' standardized test scores and that of their White counterparts. In math, the disparity is more than 50 percentage points.

When Assemblymember Patrick O'Donnell (D-Long Beach) first introduced AB 1505 in February last year, charter school operators and advocates - including Margaret Fortune, president and CEO of Fortune School, a network of predominantly Black charter schools based in Sacramento - accused the bill authors of pushing legislation to eradicate their schools.



O'Donnell and other Assemblymembers on the education committee championed two other charter school bills, AB 1506 and 1507. Those companion bills to 1505 proposed restricting the operations and expansion of charter schools.

Unlike 1505, the other two bills did not pass in the legislature.

"There is a package of bills, that has been introduced by various Assemblymembers, including our own Kevin McCarty, also a member of the California Legislative Black Caucus, which taken together amount to a ban on charter schools," said Fortune in March while the Assembly was debating the bill.

AB 1505 makes the most significant changes to California's Charter School law, which former Gov. Pete Wilson signed into law in 1992. The language and provisions in the final version of the bill includes the input of various education stakeholders in the state, including unions representing traditional public school teachers, state education administrators, academics, as well as charter school leaders and backers.

"It listens to the needs

of school districts and authorizers to be able to weigh the fiscal impacts and the community impacts before making a decision about whether or not to authorize a charter school," said Tony Thurmond, State Superintendent of Public Instruction. "At the same time, it listens to applicants who have said 'we need to have a clearer path to know how renewal will happen.' This legislation is long overdue."

The law allows local school boards, which authorize charters, to now close charter schools for fiscal and governance issues, and also to consider how a new charter school might impact the a school district financially when reviewing an application to open a new public charter school or to renew an existing charter.

It also gives authorizers the right to deny an application if a school district is experiencing financial problems, and empowers school districts or county offices of education to now oversee the operations of charter schools.

In addition, it places a two-year moratorium on "non-classroom based" charters, including

publicly-funded home-schooling and independent study programs and computer-based learning.

Under the new provisions of 1505, charter school teachers will now have to obtain training and certification required by the state to teach. They will also be subject to state level background checks before they are hired.

"We recognize this journey does not end today," said Gov Newsom at the bill's signing. "I am not naïve about this piece of legislation solving all problems - and now everybody goes back, holding hands in perpetuity."

AB 170

On Oct. 2, a day before signing AB 1505, Gov. Newsom signed AB 170, a law that gives newspapers in California a one-year extension to reclassify the contract drivers who deliver their newspapers as W-2 employees, or come up with a new way to distribute their newspapers to subscribers.

Black-owned newspapers across the state joined hundreds of others last month to call on the governor and legislature to create a carveout for their industry under

the new rules of AB 5, also known as the Dynamex Law. The publications - many of them small family-owned weeklies - said the high cost of having to immediately hire part-time contract drivers as full-time employees would have been unaffordable

and forced them out of business.

"As a constitutionally protected industry, we are fighting on many fronts to continue to report critically and objectively on issues that are important to the people of California. And CNPA, for over

"With the signing of AB 170," Brown-Hinds continued, "we appreciate the overwhelming

support from the legislature and Governor Newsom in securing more time for our industry to find a model for newspaper carriers that works for news publishers and complies with state law."

Senate Republicans submitted 12 sets of amendments to AB 5, including the one used

as the basis for AB 170 that gives a temporary reprieve to the newspaper industry.

"I am encouraged that the governor signed AB 170 into law," said Senate Republican Leader Shannon Grove. "More work needs to be done to assist independent contractors in the Golden State."

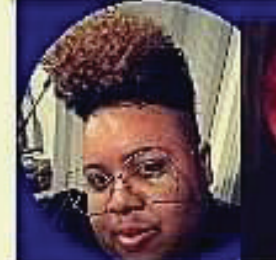

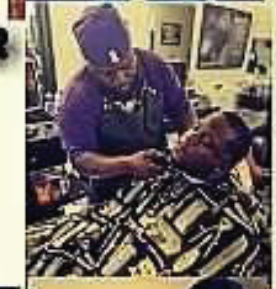
